A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

The past year—my first as Board president—saw the latest in a series of dramatic increases in the cost of living. But even in these turbulent times, the community's spirit and compassion did not waver, ensuring the work of the Caring and Sharing Exchange continued to have a positive impact.

In 2023, the Sharing in Student Success Program provided nearly 4,200 backpacks filled with grade-appropriate school supplies, helping lighten families' financial burden and enabling children to start school with confidence.

Expanding the program to Grade 9 students meant young people had more resources to help them make the critical transition to high school.

Through the Christmas Exchange Program, we supplied a record 26,921 individuals with a holiday hamper or redeemable gift voucher. For more than a century, this program has provided joy and a sense of belonging, as well as much needed food, during what can be a challenging time of year.

By eliminating duplications in services, the Coordination Service saved the community nearly \$170,000 in 2023, allowing us to help even more people in need.

These successes would not have been possible without the support of our donors, sponsors, volunteers and partners.

THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

This year, the Caring and Sharing Exchange saw a significant surge in registrations for both of our assistance programs. We are delighted to announce that, despite this growth, every applicant received the assistance they needed! Through our Christmas Exchange and Sharing in Student Success Programs, we were able to positively impact 31,119 individuals in need across Ottawa in the past year. This marks an impressive 18.4% increase from the year before. Our commitment to maximizing the impact of every dollar continued through our innovative coordination service.

Due to the kindness of individuals, groups, and businesses throughout Ottawa, our in-kind donation program totaled an astounding \$369,090 in value. Whether providing hampers for families in need or donating school supplies, their generosity greatly enhanced our programs.

The Caring and Sharing Exchange experienced an exciting phase of expansion. To address the rising cost of living, we regularly reassess the value of the Christmas Exchange Program assistance. This past year, we were delighted to expand our Sharing in Student Success Program, offering support to Grade 9 students, ensuring they enter high school equipped with all the tools for success.

THE CHRISTMAS EXCHANGE PROGRAM





Once again, thanks to our incredible donors, sponsors, and volunteers, the Caring and Sharing Exchange was able to provide holiday cheer, and alleviate financial strain during the holiday season, a time of year that can be particularly challenging for many Ottawa individuals and families in need.

Despite a 19% increase in the registration for assistance, we were able to provide all 26,921 individuals on our list with means to enjoy a warm festive meal, by delivering a food hamper or a redeemable gift voucher. Thanks to the community for helping to ensure that all our neighbours in need were able to experience the joy and warmth of the holiday season.

THE SHARING IN STUDENT SUCCESS PROGRAM



Through the Sharing in Student Success Program, the Caring and Sharing Exchange was able to provide 4,198 students with a backpack full of all the grade appropriate school supplies necessary to thrive in school, regardless of their financial circumstances. In addition, through the innovative Coordination Service, the Caring and Sharing Exchange was able to eliminate 420 duplicate applications, saving the community \$27,022, which was then reinvested to help even more children in need.

We are so grateful to our generous donors and volunteers who directly impacted the lives of students by reducing barriers to education and allowing children from families in need to return to school on an equal footing with their peers. In fact, in 2023, we expanded the program to include Grade 9 students, allowing them to begin high school with their heads held high and ready to learn.

THE COORDINATION SERVICE



Overall, the coordination service of the Caring and Sharing Exchange plays a crucial role in ensuring that their programs run smoothly, efficiently, and effectively, ultimately making a positive impact on the lives of those it serves. Through this service, the Caring and Sharing Exchange works with almost 200 community partners to eliminate any duplications in assistance at back-to-school and Christmas time, saving the community \$169,922 in 2023 which was reinvested to help even more people in need! Over the past five years, this service has saved the community \$645,310.

Since 1987, the Caring and Sharing Exchange has partnered with the Beer Store to raise funds for the Christmas Exchange program by running a City-wide bottle drive. Following a three-year in person event hiatus due to Covid, we were absolutely delighted to have been able to staff volunteers at locations across the City on Saturday, December 16, 2023. In addition, for the month of December, Beer Store employees kindly asked customers at the cash to consider donating their empties

in support of our Christmas Exchange program! Prominent community figures and Caring & Sharing Exchange followers helped spread the word, making the event a tremendous success. Thanks to many joint efforts, we were able to raise an incredible \$17,273!


